## SERIES NOTES

Denver has performed okay on the road against the OKC franchise in recent years, having gone 13-19 since the 2001-02 season ... Although the Nuggets have won 11 of the last 18 home games against the Thunder/Sonics, the OKC franchise has actually played well in Denver, having gone 13-15 at the Pepsi Center since 2002-03 ... The Nuggets have claimed 20 of the last 40 games overall against the Thunder/Sonics, dating back to the 2006-07 season ... Last season was the Thunder's fourth multi-win season against the Nuggets since 2005-06 ... Denver has recorded seven non-losing season series out of the last 13 against the Thunder/Sonics (had been seven straight until 2010-11) ... The biggest win in Nuggets regular season history (52 points) came against the OKC franchise on 3/16/08 – a 168-116 win over the Seattle SuperSonics at the Pepsi Center ... The 168 points scored by Denver on 3/16/08 also marked the most points the Nuggets have ever scored in a non-overtime game.

## #6 IS IN THE BOOKS

The Nuggets took on the Charlotte Hornets on the road on 3/31, and despite falling just short, Nikola Jokic was unstoppable throughout and notched his sixth career triple-double in the process.

The Joker went off for 26 points (11-16 FG), 13 rebounds and 10 assists and in the process set the record for the most triple-doubles in a single season by any foreign-born player in NBA history with six. It is also tied with Kevin Garnett (2002-03) for the most triple-doubles in a single season by a center since at least the 1983-84 season and it is the most triple-doubles in a season by a Nugget since Fat Lever had nine in 1988-89.

Additionally, there have only been eight players in the NBA since 1983 to post a 23-13-10 triple-double while shooting at least 68% from the field: Jokic, Blake Griffin, Kevin Durant, Larry Johnson, Magic Johnson (twice), David Robinson, Hakeem Olajuwon and Michael Jordan.

The Nuggets needed a big win in Indiana on 3/26 to keep the momentum going towards the playoffs, and Nikola Jokic certainly did his part.

The Joker tallied nine points, seven rebounds and three assists in the opening frame en route to a big 30-point, 17-rebound, 5-assist performance in the road win.

Jokic becomes the first Nugget since at least 1983 to post 30+ points, 17+ rebounds and 5+ assists, and he is just the fourth player in the NBA to accomplish this in under 35 minutes (Cousins, O'Neal and Jordan) since 1983. He is the only one of the four to do so while shooting over 67% from the field.

## 5 IN 18

Nikola Jokic played 121 career games without registering a triple-double, he since racked up five within 18 games from 2/3 to 3/16. Looks like he has the hang of it.

The second-year center tallied 17 points, 14 rebounds and 11 assists vs. LAC on 3/16, moving him into fourth place for most triple-doubles this season with five. He also becomes the first Nugget with five triple-doubles in a single season since Fat Lever in 1989-90 and the first NBA center with five triple-doubles in a season since David Robinson in 1993-94.

## BACK TO BACK LIKE HE'S ON THE COVER OF LETHAL WEAPON

Another day, another Nikola Jokic triple-double. His fourth career triple-double (13 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists) came at MIL on 3/1, the very next night after recording his third at CHI on 2/28.

Jokic is just the third Nugget in team history to post triple-doubles in consecutive games, joining Dikembe Mutombo (April 1994) and Fat Lever (multiple occasions).

Nikola has now recorded his first four career triple-doubles, all coming since February 3 vs. MIL. He is just the fourth player in NBA history to record his first four triple-doubles in a span of less than 30 days (see chart above). Jokic accomplished this in just 27 days, with seven of those days holding zero NBA games due to the All-Star break. If you don't account for those days, it took the Joker just 20 days and 13 games to put up four monster triple-doubles. Additionally, he currently ranks second in the league for most triple-doubles since the start of February.

## NIKOLA NETS TD NUMBER 3

In front of a sold out United Center in Chicago, with a mob of loyal Serbian fans spread throughout, Nikola Jokic delivered his third career triple-double by posting 19 points, 16 rebounds and 10 assists in a big Nuggets' road win. Denver is now 3-0 this season when Jokic records a triple-double.

All three of The Joker's triple-doubles came in the month of February, giving him the second most triple-doubles during the month. He also now has the most triple-doubles of any player listed at 6-10 or taller. He also holds the record for most triple-doubles by any Nugget before his 23<sup>rd</sup> birthday.

## TRIPLE-DOUBLE NUMBER 2 = ✓

Well that didn't take long. Just six games after registering his first career triple-double, Nikola Jokic decided to mess around and do it again. The big man tallied 17 points, a career-high 21 rebounds and a career-high 12 assists in a big win over Golden State on 2/13.

It was just the 16<sup>th</sup> time in NBA history that a player registered a triple-double with 17+ points and 20+ rebounds, with two of those games belonging to Nugget legend Fat Lever.

Additionally, Jokic is the first player to record 17+ points, 21+ rebounds and 12+ assists in a single game since Wilt Chamberlain (22, 27, 29) and Elgin Baylor (35, 21, 12) both did so on the exact same date in 1968 (3/19/68) – via Elias Sports Bureau.

## IT WAS ONLY A MATTER OF TIME FOR THE JOKER

It was only a matter of when, not if, Nikola Jokic would register his first career triple-double in the NBA. He has had a couple games where he was just a few rebounds or assists away and came closest when he was just one assist shy in his monster 27 point, 15 rebound, nine assist game vs. DAL on 12/19. Well, the wait is over. On 2/3 vs. MIL, the Serbian center tallied 20 points, 13 rebounds and a career-high tying 11 assists to notch the first triple-double of his young career.

The Joker's triple-double was the 73<sup>rd</sup> in Nuggets NBA franchise history but was just the second ever point/rebound/assist triple-double by center in team NBA history (Marcus Camby had the only other one with 13 points, 15 rebounds and 10 assists vs. SEA on 3/16/08. Additionally, it was the first triple-double by any Nugget since Andre Iguodala had one on 4/10/13 vs. SA.

## **NIKOLA'S NOTEWORTHY NIGHT AT THE GARDEN**

In just his second career game playing at Madison Square Garden, Nikol Jokic made sure every Knicks fan in attendance will never forget his name. Jokic had a solid first half at NY on 2/10 with 15 points, four rebounds and three assists. With his Nuggets trailing by two going into the half, Nikola put on a clinic in the third quarter, scoring 18 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the field and hitting both his three-point attempts to help give Denver a double-digit lead that they never surrendered.

The Joker finished with a career-high 40 points (17-23 FG, 2-3 3FG), nine rebounds, five assists and two steals in 37 minutes. It was a legendary performance in a legendary venue, and below is a look at some the historic lists that the 21-year-old Serbian center added his name too:

- Jokic is just the fourth player under the age of 22 in NBA history to post a 40-point game at Madison Square Garden ... The others are Kyrie Irving (2012), Michael Jordan (1985) and Rick Barry (1965)
- Only nine players in NBA history have had a 40-point, 9-rebound, 5-assist game under the age of 22: Kobe Bryant, Anthony Davis, Kevin Durant, Blake Griffin, LeBron James, Michael Jordan, Tracy McGrady, Karl-Anthony Towns and Nikola Jokic
- Nikola is just the second Nugget in team history to have 40+ points at Madison Square Garden (David Thompson had 41 in 1978)
- Just the third Nugget to score 40+ points on 73% shooting since 1983-84 (Carmelo Anthony did twice in '08 and Alex English did three times from '84-'88)
- Jokic, James Harden, Jimmy Butler, LeBron James, Russell Westbrook and Anthony Davis are the only players this season to post 40+ points, 9+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 2+ steals in a game ... Jokic is the only one to do so while shooting at least 73% from the field
- Nikola is the first Nugget with 40 points, nine rebounds, five assists and two steals in a game since Michael Adams accomplished this in 1991

## **THE MAGIC CONTINUES**

There isn't much that hasn't been said about second-year center Nikola Jokic at this point, and there isn't much the talented big man hasn't shown he can do either. Over the last 55 games, Jokic has posted 37 double-doubles (including 20 20/10 games and six triple-doubles) and is averaging 18.8 points, 10.8 rebounds and 5.5 assists on 59% shooting from the field, 34% from three and 84% from the charity stripe.

This stretch has found him creeping up numerous leaderboards, ranking 8<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in PER and second among all centers (Anthony Davis) at 26.24. According to basketball-reference.com's metrics, Jokic is 6<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in offensive rating (the number of points produced by a player per 100 individual possessions) at 125.6. He is also just one of three players in the NBA this season to average 15.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game, joining Russell Westbrook and DeMarcus Cousins. Additionally, he is the youngest player to average these numbers for a season since Chris Webber did so at the age of 21 in 1994-95 and he would be the first player in NBA history to average 15+ points, 9+ rebounds and 4+ assists in under 30 minutes per game.

The Joker recently put together a stretch of three straight games with 29+ points and 11+ rebounds, the first Nugget to accomplish this since Carmelo Anthony in Dec. 2007. Jokic averaged a ridiculous 31.3 points, 12.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists, 1.00 steals and 1.67 blocks on 62% shooting in his three games from 1/16 to 1/19.

## **JOKIC ADDS TO HIS COLLECTION**

We've already made note of the many big games that center Nikola Jokic has displayed in his young career, here's a few more to add to the list:

- Posted 12 points, 19 rebounds, 9 assists and 5 steals at HOU on 4/5 ... Dating back to 1983-84, only two players reached those numbers in a single game: Fat Lever for Denver vs. Cleveland on 3/2/88 and Charles Barkley for Philadelphia vs. Indiana on 4/11/86.
- 21 points, 10 rebounds, 7 assists and 4 steals in 27 minutes vs. BOS on 3/10 ... Is the only NBA player since '83-84 to reach those numbers in 27 minutes.
- 31 points (13-15 FG), 14 boards and four assists vs. CHA on 3/4 ... He's the first player to reach those numbers on 86% shooting since Pau Gasol in 2006.
- Posted 29 points, 14 rebounds, eight assists and two blocks vs. PHX on 1/26, the first Nugget to do so since Fat Lever in 1986.
- Scored 35 points to go with 12 rebounds, four assists and two blocks at SA on 1/19, the first Nugget since Antonio McDyess in 2000 and just the fourth Nugget since 1983 (McDyess, Mutombo, English) to reach those plateaus.
- Had 29 points, 15 rebounds and a career-high three blocks at LAL on 1/17 ... He is just the sixth Nugget since 1983 to reach those numbers (Camby, LaFrentz, McDyess, Clark and Mutombo) and is the first to do since Marcus Camby in 2005.
- Posted 30 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three steals vs. ORL on 1/16 ... He is one of just seven players this season to reach those numbers (Harden, Westbrook, Cousins, Butler, Davis, Antetokounmpo) and the first Nugget to do so since Michael Adams in Jan. 1991.
- His 22 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists in 30 minutes vs. IND on 1/12 makes him one of just 14 players since 1983 to accomplish this and the first Nugget since Fat Lever in 1990 to do so.
- Jokic posted 21 points, 13 rebounds and five assists in 24 minutes at GS on 1/2, joining Fat Lever (1/11/90 vs. ORL) as the only NBA players since 1983 to have those numbers in under 25 minutes.
- He had 24 points, 10 rebounds, four assists and three steals in 32 minutes at LAC on 12/26. He is one of just three players this season to post 24+ points, 10+ rebounds, 4+ assists and 3+ steals in 32 minutes or less, with James Harden and Kevin Love being the only other two.
- He had 25 points, seven rebounds and four assists in 22 minutes v s. PHI on 12/30. He is just the third players since 1983 to reach those numbers in under 23 minutes with Hakeem Olajuwon and A.J. English being the other two.
- Posted 27 points (13-17 FG), 15 rebounds and nine assists vs. DAL on 12/19. He is just the second Nugget to reach those numbers since 1983 (Lever) He is also just the eighth center since 1983 to do this, joining DeMarcus Cousins, Tim Duncan, Patrick Ewing, Hakeem Olajuwon, Shaquille O'Neal, Robert Parish, Jeff Ruland and Chris Webber. Jokic is the only one to do so while shooting 70% from the field.
- Had 27 points (10-12 FG) to go with 11 rebounds and four assists in just 26 minutes at DAL on 12/12. He is just the second player since '94-95 to have 27, 11 and 4 in under 27 minutes of play and just the sixth to do so since 1983. He is also the first to accomplish this coming off the bench.
- Registered 17 points, 14 rebounds and three assists in just 24 minutes vs. MIA on 11/30. Since 1983-84, Jokic is just the sixth player in the NBA to reach 17, 14 and 3 in 24 minutes or less, joining a cast of some impressive names (Sullinger, Duncan, Barkley, Kemp, Lever and Olajuwon). He is the first Nugget to accomplish this since Fat Lever in 1990 and the first reserve to do so since Shawn Kemp in 1992.

## 2016-17 NUGGETS NOTES

### **YOU CAN COUNT ON GARY**

Nuggets starting shooting guard Gary Harris was forced to miss 20 of the first 25 games of this season due to injury, but since his return he has provided the Nuggets with consistent scoring both from beyond the arc and at the rim while also being one of the team's best individual and help defenders.

In 57 games this season (56 starts), Harris is averaging a career-high 14.9 points, 3.2 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.25 steals while ranking 8<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in three-point field goal percentage (.420). He also leads all shooting guards in field goal percentage at 50.2%.

The third-year Michigan State product recently scored 20+ points in three straight games (2/15 – 2/24), the longest streak of his career. He averaged 23.3 points, 2.7 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.67 steals on 51% shooting from the field and 53% from three during that stretch.

## **NUGGETS OFFENSE CLICKING ON ALL CYLINDERS**

The Nuggets offense has been spectacular over the last two months, scoring 120+ in 18 of their last 44 games while shooting over 50% from the field in 20 of those games. The high-powered offense scored a season-high 140 points vs. IND on 1/12 in London and registered back-to-back games of 70+ points in the paint on 1/12 and 1/16. Their willingness to share the ball has been instrumental in their success, averaging 27.3 assists in their last 44 games. Since January 12<sup>th</sup>, Denver's offense ranks among the top in the league in almost every category (chart to right).

The offense was on an even higher level over the three game stretch from 1/12 to 1/17. Denver scored at least 125 points in all three of those game and shot at least 50% in all three as well. They were the first team to score 125+ points and shoot at least 56.8% from the field in three straight games since the Phoenix Suns in 2009. They also averaged a remarkable 71.3 points in the paint as well as 20.7 points on the break during that stretch.

## **MURRAY BRINGS HOME THE MVP!**

Nuggets rookie Jamal Murray was selected alongside second-year teammates Nikola Jokic and Emmanuel Mudiay as member of the Team World roster at the 2017 BBVA Compass Rising Stars Challenge at All-Star Weekend in New Orleans. Nuggets fans were not left disappointed as Jamal Murray stole the show.

The rookie electrified the crowd with a game-high 36 points and a game-high 11 assists while knocking down 9-of-14 (.643) from beyond the three-point line. He was named MVP for his efforts, becoming the third Nugget ever to win the award (Anthony and Faried) and the first since Kenneth Faried in 2013.

His nine threes were the second most in the history of the game (Daniel Gibson of the Cavaliers made a record 11 in 2008) while his 11 assists were the most by any player in the Rising Stars Challenge since John Wall handed out 22 assists in 2011. **He is the first player in the history of the Rising Stars game (started in 1994) to ever post 30+ points and 11+ assists.**

## **A RAINSTORM FOR THE AGES**

The Nuggets played host to the 46-8 Golden State Warriors on Feb. 13 with only nine of their 15 players available for action (missing were Arthur, Chandler, Faried, Gallinari, Mudiay and brand new Nugget Mason Plumlee). It was an extremely tough matchup on paper, but once the game started, so did the three-point downpour.

The Nuggets went 7-of-11 from three in the first quarter while scoring a season-high 42 points in the frame. It didn't slow up in the second quarter, where they went a ridiculous 9-of-12 from long range to **tie the all-time NBA record for made threes in a half with 16.** Denver scored a season-high 79 points in the first half and took a 25-point lead into the break.

Denver maintained their lead while still putting them from the outside, and **they finished the game with a then all-time record tying 24 made threes on 41 attempts (59%). Denver bested their previous franchise best of 19 made threes in a game and 11 in a half. They also dished out 34 assists on their 48 made field goals, improving to 61-1 in their last 62 regulation games with 30+ assists.**

Not only did the Nuggets put on an electric show, but there was a massive crowd in attendance to appreciate it. The announced attendance of 19,941 was the third largest crowd ever for a Nuggets regular season home game and the seventh largest all-time including the playoffs.

## **NIKOLA AND MASON - THE DELIVERY MEN**

Nikola Jokic continues to impress, and one of his main talents that has caught people's attention is his creative and pin-point passing ability. The Joker has handed out at least five assists in 30 games this season and currently ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the NBA among all centers in assists per game (chart to right).

He recently posted his first six career triple-doubles, with three of them being the only times in Denver's NBA team history a center has posted the numbers he did in those monster triple-doubles.

And when the Nuggets made a move to add Mason Plumlee on Feb. 13<sup>th</sup>, they added one of the other best play-making bigs in the NBA. Plumlee, who ranks fifth among all centers in assists per game, dished a career-high 12 helpers on 1/18 vs. DET and came two assists shy of his first career triple-double vs. BRK on 2/24 in just his third game as a member of the Nuggets.

## **GALLINARI CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

As mentioned below, Danilo Gallinari joined the Nuggets in 2011 and he brought his three-point accuracy along with him. Gallo has made 836 threes on 36.9% shooting in his eight-year career. 535 of those threes have come in a Nuggets uniform and on 12/15 vs. POR he moved past Dale Ellis into fourth place on the Nuggets all-time made three-pointers list (chart to right). He also recently moved past Chauncey Billups for third place on the list by dropping in four from long range at CHA on 3/31. His next milestone on the all-time list is 96 three-pointers away.

## **NUGGETS DOMINATING THE GLASS**

The Nuggets have excelled on the glass this season, outrebounding their opponent in 60 games and tying their opponent twice.

Denver is averaging 46.4 rebounds per game which is the second best mark in the NBA. Their 11.9 offensive rebounds per game is good for third in the league. Denver is the only team with four games of 20+ offensive rebounds and their 26 vs. BRK on 12/7 is an NBA season-high. The Nuggets have outrebounded their opponents by 10-or-more boards 26 times, including a season-high +25 vs. Golden State on 2/13 and an impressive +24 over the Pelicans on opening night.

## **GALLO IS MR. CONSISTENT**

Danilo Gallinari became a member of the Denver Nuggets in 2011 and has been a consistent, steady force for the team since then. Coming off a career-year in 2015-16, this year has been no different.

Through his 63 games, Gallo is averaging a team-high 18.2 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 33.9 minutes per game. The veteran forward has scored in double-figures in every game but one and has shown his trademark ability to knock down threes and get to the basket and draw fouls.

Gallinari has hit a three in every game but six and has knocked down multiple threes 37 times. He has also gotten to the line for at least eight attempts in 19 games, including 11 games with 10+ attempts. He has been knocking his free throws down per usual and is one of just five players in the league to attempt 6.0 free throws while shooting 89.5%-or-better from the line (chart to the right).

## WILSON CHANDLER DOING IT ALL

Veteran forward Wilson Chandler has been huge for the Nuggets this season, whether coming off the bench or in the starting lineup. Through his 71 games of the season (33 starts), Chandler is averaging 15.7 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists on 46.1% shooting from the field in 31.0 minutes per game.

Chandler dropped in 27 points (6-11 3FG) and grabbed a season-high 15 rebounds at BRK on 12/7, becoming the only player this season to have 27 and 15 with six made threes. He also has had a 28 point/11 rebound game in a win over PHX on 11/16. It was his first game with at least 28 points and 11 rebounds. He followed that up with a 25-point, 10-rebound game vs. TOR on 11/18, his first career back-to-back 20/10 games. Just a few games later, Chandler registered his first career 30/10 game with a then season-high 32 points and 11 rebounds in his first start of the season vs. OKC on 11/25. He recently scored a career-high 36 points (5-10 3FG) to go with 12 rebounds and four assists, the first Nugget ever to post 36 points and 12 rebounds while making 5+ threes in a single game.

Ill Will has scored 10+ in 56 of his 71 games, including 21 20-point games. He's paced the Nuggets bench in scoring 22 times so far and is one of just 18 players in the NBA to average 15.5+ points and 6.5+ rebounds.

## NUGGETS WIN BIG IN LONDON

On Jan. 12, 2017, the Denver Nuggets hosted a "home" game at O2 Arena in London, England against the Indiana Pacers in front of a sellout crowd. The Nuggets were ready to go from the opening tip and put together their most complete and impressive performance of the season in a 140-112 blowout victory.

Denver scored a season-high 140 points, shot 57.1% from the field, made a season-high tying 52 field goals, dished out a season-high 37 assists and hit 15 threes. They also scored 70 points in the paint, scored 23 second chance points and 29 on the break.



## JAMAL MURRAY SCORES IN A FLASH

On 11/13 at POR, Murray scored a then career-high 19 points (6-12 FG, 5-9 3FG) at POR on 11/13. 12 of those points came when the Nuggets found themselves trailing 105-93 with 36 seconds left in the game before Murray erupted, hitting four three-pointers in a span of 27 seconds.

According to the Elias Sports Bureau, no NBA player has scored 12-or-more points in under 30 seconds in at least the last 20 years. Additionally, his five made three-pointers makes him just the 14<sup>th</sup> NBA player under the age of 20 to make at least five threes in a single game. He is the first Nugget under the age of 20 to hit five threes since Carmelo Anthony on 12/26/03 vs. DEN.

Just four games later vs. CHI on 11/22, Murray dropped in 13 points in less than two minutes during a 24-0 run by Denver in the second quarter. He finished with a career-high 24 points on 9-of-13 shooting from the field including 3-of-4 from long range.

## EMMANUEL MUDIAY SCORCHES

The Nuggets faced off against the Boston Celtics on the road on Nov. 6, and it didn't take long for second-year guard Emmanuel Mudiay to steal the show. He got off to a nice start, scoring seven of Denver's first 22 points through the first 7:30 of the opening quarter before becoming scorching hot.

Mudiay proceeded to score 17 of the Nuggets' final 22 points of the quarter in a span of four minutes and thirty seconds. He put together a scoring frenzy of aggressive drives, fadeaway jumpers and three-pointers that had the Boston crowd speechless and the Nuggets' bench going wild. He finished the first quarter with 24 points on 9-of-10 shooting (3-4 3FG), outscoring the entire Celtics team by one point. He finished the game with a career-high tying 30 points. It was the most points scored by a Nugget in a single quarter since Ty Lawson had 24 in the third vs. Minnesota on 4/9/11 and is tied for the fourth most points scored in a quarter by a Nugget since 1996 (chart to right).

## 2016-17 MINI-NUGGETS

- **YOUNG GUNS AND THE VET GET WIN AT DALLAS:** With a handful of players out at DAL on 4/11, the Nuggets earned a road win behind rookies Malik Beasley (career-highs w/ 16 points and 5 rebounds), Juancho Hernangomez (14 points and 6 boards) and Jamal Murray (first career double-double), third-year guard Gary Harris (first career game with 20 points, 8 rebounds and 8 assists) and 16 year veteran Mike Miller (8 points, 7 rebounds and 6 assists) ... Denver hit 18 threes, handed out 31 assists on their 41 made field goals and outrebounded the Mavericks by 11 in the victory.
- **Mike Miller** tallied eight points (2-3 3FG), seven rebounds, six assists and a steal in 29 minutes at DAL on 4/11 ... It was his first game with 8+ points, 7+ rebounds and 6+ assists since March 2010 and the 37<sup>th</sup> such game of his career.
- **Jamal Murray** posted 10 points and a career-high 10 assists in 33 minutes at DAL on 4/11 ... It was his first career double-double.
- Denver connected on 18-of-42 threes at DAL on 4/11, just the 5<sup>th</sup> time in team history making 18+ threes -- with three of those coming since 1/3/17.
- With Denver's loss vs. OKC on 4/9, the Nuggets were officially eliminated from playoff contention with two games remaining ... During the game, Russell Westbrook broke an all-time NBA record by recording his 42<sup>nd</sup> triple-double of the season, surpassing Oscar Robertson's 41 in 1961-62.
- **Danilo Gallinari** scored a season-high 34 points (12-20 FG) to go with 10 rebounds, three assists and two steals vs. OKC on 4/9 ... It was his 14<sup>th</sup> career 30-point game and his second ever with at least 10 rebounds ... Gallo has scored 20+ in four of his last five games, averaging 25.4 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists on 54% shooting from the field and 43% from three during this stretch.
- **Jamal Murray** scored a career 30 points (10-14 FG) to go with four rebounds and five assists as the starting point guard ... It was his 7<sup>th</sup> game with at least 20 points ... Murray's 30-point game tonight was the seventh instance of a 30-point game by a rookie this season.
- **Danilo Gallinari** dropped in 28 points (5-10 3FG) and five rebounds at NO on 4/4, one game after posting 29 points (11-19 FG) and five boards at Miami on 4/2 ... It's the first time in his career he has had 28+ points and 5+ boards in consecutive games.
- **Gary Harris** tallied 23 points (10-12 FG), eight rebounds, five assists and two steals at NO on 4/4 ... He is one of just three players this season to post 23+ points, 8+ boards and 5+ assists while shooting 80% from the field (Antetokounmpo and Griffin) and is the only one to do so with two steals as well.
- **Danilo Gallinari** recorded his third 20/10 game of the year with 21 points (17-18 FT) and 11 rebounds at IND on 3/24 ... He is the 10<sup>th</sup> Nugget in team history to make 17+ free throws in a game (Anthony – 7, Gallo – 4, Billups – 3, Thompson – 3, Adams, English, Hanzlik, Issel, Newman and Schayes).
- **NUGGETS ARE NOW...** 24-6 when shooting over 50% from the field ... 33-7 when outshooting opponent ... 67-3 in last 70 regulation games with 30+ assists ... 10-3 when scoring 60+ points in the paint ... 16-2 when scoring more points off turnovers than opponent ... 10-7 when all 5 starters score 10+

- **NUGGETS SWEEP PACERS:** The Nuggets finished the season series with Indiana with a 2-0 sweep, their second in the last three seasons ... In two games against Indiana, Denver scored 30+ points in all eight quarters and averaged 132.5 points per game.
- **BIG WIN OVER CAVS:** The Nuggets earned a big home win over Cleveland on 3/22, beating the defending Champs 126-113 ... The Nuggets outshot the Cavs from the floor, shooting 53% from the field and 100% from the line (13-13 FT) ... Denver outscored the Cavs 70 to 30 in the paint, the largest discrepancy of the year ... They also committed a season low six turnovers while recording 35 assists on 51 made field goals.
- **Will Barton** posted 24 points, seven rebounds and eight assists off the bench at HOU on 3/20 ... He is the only reserve in the NBA to reach those numbers this year and just the 24<sup>th</sup> to do so dating back to 1983.
- The Nuggets won a season-long four consecutive games from Mar. 10 through Mar. 16, beating Boston, Sacramento, L.A. Lakers and L.A. Clippers.
- **Jamal Murray** tallied 22 points (5-8 3FG) and three assists vs. LAL on 3/13 ... It was his 6<sup>th</sup> 20-point game and his 22<sup>nd</sup> game leading the reserves in scoring (most on the team).
- **Will Barton** erupted for a career-high 35 points (12-18 FG, 7-10 3FG) to go with five rebounds and three assists vs. LAC on 3/16 ... It is the most points by a Nuggets' reserve since Wilson Chandler had 35 at CHI on 3/18/13.
  - ❖ In the three-point era there has only been seven reserves to score 35+ points and hit 7+ threes: Will Barton, Marcus Thornton, Rodrigue Beaubois, Kevin Martin, Donyell Marshall all once and JR Smith three times, all with Denver.
- **Mason Plumlee** posted 10 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and three blocks in 30 minutes as a starter vs. LAC on 3/16 ... In eight starts for Denver, Plumlee has averaged 11.3 points, 9.3 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 1.38 blocks in 30.5 minutes per game.
  - ❖ Since the 2008-09 season, the only two Nuggets to post 10+ points, 10+ rebounds, 6+ assists and 3+ blocks in a single game are Plumlee and teammate Nikola Jokic (1/24 vs. UTA).
- **NUGGETS GET BOTH VS. BEANTOWN:** The Nuggets finished their season series against Boston with a 2-0 sweep ... It is the first time sweeping the Celtics since 2004-05 and just the third time in Nuggets NBA history (also did in 1987-88).
- **WILSON WITH 20+ IN THREE STRAIGHT:** Wilson Chandler has scored 20+ points in three straight games (second longest streak of career, had four in April 2009) and is averaging 26.7 points, 8.0 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.67 steals on 56% (31-55FG) shooting from the field during this stretch.
- **Nikola Jokic** recorded 21 points, 10 rebounds, seven assists and four steals in 26.5 minutes vs. BOS on 3/11 ... He is the only player since at least 1983-84 to reach all those numbers in under 27 minutes of play.
- **Wilson Chandler** scored a career-high 36 points (5-10 3FG) to go with 12 rebounds, four assists and two steals in vs. SAC on 3/6 ... He is the first Nugget in team history to post 36 points, 12 rebounds and make five threes in a single game ... He is the first Nugget with 36 points, 12 rebounds and four assists in a game since Antonio McDyess in December 2000.
- **Nikola Jokic** posted 31 points (13-15 FG), 14 rebounds and four assists vs. CHA on 3/4 ... He is the first NBA player to reach those numbers on 86% shooting since Pau Gasol in 2006 and the first Nugget with 31, 14 and 4 in a single game since Antonio McDyess did so twice in December 2000.
- Denver made at least 10 three-pointers in 12 consecutive games from 2/4 to 3/1, the longest such streak in Nuggets' franchise history.
- **WINDY CITY WIN:** The Nuggets got a big 125-107 road win on 2/28 at CHI behind 69 second-half points and a combined 88 from the starting unit ... Denver shot 56.3% from the field and outrebounded the second best rebounding team in the league by 10.
- Rookie **Juancho Hernangomez** had a career night vs. GS on 2/13, scoring a career-high 27 points (6-9 3FG) to go with a career-high 10 rebounds ... He is the only rookie in the NBA this season to make 6-or-more threes.
- **WILL THRILLS:** Will Barton had a big night with 24 points (4-8 3FG), 10 rebounds and seven assists vs. GS on 2/13 ... It was his first career game reaching those numbers and his 13<sup>th</sup> career double-double (sixth career 20/10 game).
- **BIG WIN FOR NUGS IN NY:** The Nuggets headed into Madison Square Garden on 2/10 and they left with a big road win that saw everyone contribute ... Denver's starters combined for a season-high 104 points and shot a scorching 65% (43-66 FG) from the field in the win ... The Nuggets dished out 30 assists, drained 16 threes, outrebounded the Knicks by 11 and overcame a 12-point first-half deficit to claim the victory.
- **THE 40-POINT MAN:** Nikola Jokic dropped in a career-high 40 points (17-23 FG) to go with nine rebounds, five assists and two steals at NY on 2/10 ... He is the first Nugget with a 40-point game since Danilo Gallinari had two in 2014-15 ... Much more on Nikola's big night in note section above.
- **Nikola Jokic** posted 13 points, four rebounds and nine assists in 24 minutes vs. DAL on 2/6 ... He is just the fifth Nugget since 1983 to reach those numbers in 24 minutes or less (Andre Miller in 2013, Carmelo Anthony in 2009, Jalen Rose in 1995 and Robert Pack in 1993 are others).
- **Wilson Chandler** tallied 23 points, eight rebounds, three assists, two steals and a season-high four blocks in 41 minutes vs. MIL on 2/3 ... He is just the fifth player this season to reach all those plateaus and just the second Nugget since 1983 to do so as well (LaFrentz in 2000 is only other).
- **Kenneth Faried** posted 19 points and 11 rebounds in 25 minutes vs. MIL on 2/3 ... He had four straight double-doubles and averaged 16.3 points, 13.0 rebounds and 1.25 steals on 63% shooting from the field and 70% shooting from the free throw line from 1/28 to 2/3.
- **Kenneth Faried** had 21 points, 13 rebounds, two assists, two steals and two blocks at PHX on 1/28 ... He is the first Nugget since Carmelo Anthony in 2007 to reach all those numbers and just the 13<sup>th</sup> Nugget since 1983 to do so ... Denver is 24-14 (.632) all-time when Faried has a 20/10 game.
- **Nikola Jokic** tallied 23 points, 11 rebounds, six assists, two steals and three blocks vs. UTA on 1/24 ... He is the first player to reach all those plateaus this season and is the only Nugget since at least 1983 to accomplish this as well.
- The Nuggets shot at least 56.8% from the field in three straight games from 1/12 to 1/17, the longest such streak by Denver since at least 1983.

- **Kenneth Faried** posted back-to-back 20-point games in extremely efficient fashion on 1/16 and 1/17 ... Over those two games he averaged 20.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.00 steals while shooting 86.4% (19-22 FG) from the field.
- **Nikola Jokic** had a monster night with 29 points, 15 rebounds and a career-high three blocks at LAL on 1/17 ... He is one of just six Nuggets to reach those numbers since 1983 ... He followed that up with a career-high 35 points, 12 rebounds, four assists and two blocks at SA on 1/19, one of just four Nuggets to reach those plateaus since 1983 (McDyess, Mutombo and English).
- Just one game after Denver scored a season-high 140 points vs. IND on 1/12, they registered 125 vs. ORL on 1/16 ... During these two games, Denver scored 30+ points in seven straight quarters and registered three straight halves with at least 67 points.
- Denver scored 100+ points in 10 straight games (12/15 – 1/3), the longest such streak since they had 13 straight in Jan. 2004.
- **Nikola Jokic** posted eight points, seven rebounds, six assists and three blocks before fouling out in 19 minutes vs. ATL on 12/23 ... He is the only NBA player since 1983 to have 8+ points, 7+ rebounds, 6+ assists and 3+ blocks in 19 minutes or less.
- **Kenneth Faried** scored a season-high 25 points (10-11 FG) to go with seven rebounds, two assists and three blocks in 28 minutes vs. NY on 12/17 ... He is the first player since Brad Daugherty in 1992 to post 25+ points, 7+ boards and 3+ blocks on 90% shooting in under 29 minutes.

## HEAD COACH MICHAEL MALONE

**Overall Record:** 111-158 (3<sup>rd</sup> season)

Michael Malone is entering his second season as head coach of the Denver Nuggets. He was named the 16th head coach in Denver's NBA franchise history on June 15, 2015.

Malone possesses over 20 years of coaching experience, 14 coming in the NBA with five different teams – Golden State, New Orleans, Cleveland, New York and Sacramento. The teams that Malone has been a member of the coaching staff have amassed eight playoff appearances, including one NBA Finals showing and two conference finals appearances.

Before joining the Nuggets, Malone served as the head coach of the Sacramento Kings where he posted a record of 39-67 spanning two seasons. Before his time with the Kings, Malone was the lead assistant for the Golden State Warriors under Mark Jackson from 2011-13 where they appeared in the playoffs both seasons.

Prior to Golden State, Malone worked as the lead assistant to Monty Williams in New Orleans and helped the Hornets achieve a 46-36 record and a trip to the 2011 NBA Playoffs. The Hornets were the most improved defensive team in the NBA in 2011, allowing a league-best 8.7 fewer points per game than in the previous campaign (94.0 ppg, after giving up 102.7 ppg in 2009-10).

Malone also served as an assistant coach under Mike Brown for the Cleveland Cavaliers for five seasons, during which the Cavs posted a 272-138 (.663) record, the third-best mark in the NBA over that span. The Cavaliers made five consecutive playoff appearances during Malone's time on the bench, reaching the NBA Finals in 2007 and the Eastern Conference Finals in 2009. In 2008-09, the Cavs notched a franchise record and NBA-best 66 wins, with Malone and the rest of the team's staff earning the right to coach the Eastern Conference All-Star squad. In 2009-10, the Cavaliers again captured the league's best regular season record with 61 wins.

Malone's NBA coaching career began with a four-season stint with the New York Knicks, where he originally joined Jeff Van Gundy's staff as a coaching associate in the summer of 2001, and was promoted to assistant coach in May 2003.

Before joining the NBA, Malone coached seven years in the college ranks, with his last stop coming at Manhattan College where he was the lead assistant. During the 1998-99 season Malone worked at the University of Virginia as its director of men's basketball administration. Malone also spent three seasons (1995-96 – 1997-98) at Providence College under New York Basketball Hall of Fame coach Pete Gillen after beginning his coaching career working for Greg Kampe at Oakland University in Michigan.

Malone is a two-time participant in the NBA's "Basketball Without Borders" program, having coached at the league's global outreach camps in Puerto Rico (2006) and Argentina (2005). He has also served several stints as the summer league head coach for the Hornets, Cavaliers and Knicks, and was one of six NBA coaches to participate in the NBA Pre-Draft Camp in Chicago in 2004 and 2005. Malone also served as an assistant coach for the Canadian Men's Senior National Team for three years. He helped guide the Canadian team to a top-four finish in the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship in Puerto Rico, qualifying Canada for the 2010 World Championships.

A native of Queens, New York, Malone played college basketball at Loyola College in Maryland, where he graduated with a BA degree in 1994. He is a graduate of New Jersey's Seton Hall Prep where he played two years under Bob Farrell. Malone also played a season under Tom Blackburn at Worcester Academy (Mass.).

Michael is the son of longtime NBA coach and former Kings and current Detroit Pistons Assistant Coach Brendan Malone, who has coached over 27 years in the league.

He and his wife, Jocelyn, have two daughters, Caitlin and Bridget.
